- 9.1 PL had given some thought to a Tree Planting Scheme as there had been a lot of very large trees, mainly Elms, around the village, and trees planted now would benefit the village in some years to come.
- KH suggested that he looked at the types of trees suitable for planting in the various situations around the village. KH
- 9.2 BE raised the question as to whether the group should look at recycling within the village.
- PL replied that there was a plan by the local council to provide further recycling collections by the year 2006 and after the mess caused by the large waste paper skip some years previous a recycling center in the village would probably not be appreciated.
- 9.3 PL told the group how he had done a full survey of the churchyard some years previous to plot every grave and name of every person buried within. It would appear that it would be possible for cremation tablets to be placed around the perimeter of the grave yard against the wall and the Rector had confirmed that this was a possibility - although at present there is no room for more burials. But again one of the other groups had approached the Rector about this issue.
- 9.4 PL commented on the condition of Fakeham Lane (off Bridgwater Road) and that it was a possible health hazard and an eye-sore.
